



Corona Virus Safety Measures at Sherwood Forest Holiday Park

We're still closed pending government restrictions being lifted, but wanted to give you an update in relation to re-opening and the corona virus safety measures at Sherwood Forest Holiday Park. We are still to receive more specific guidance on health and safety from the government and our governing body, the [BH&HPA](#), but will obviously incorporate that into our planning as necessary.

We're currently working towards a provisional date of 4 July to re-open, but of course, with the ongoing uncertainty around Covid-19, this is subject to change. What is also unclear at the moment, is whether we'll be able to open our facilities, at least initially, and this may impact the number and type of guests that we have on-site. For now though, we are assuming we will be fully open and operational by 4 July, but due to the ongoing uncertainty, we are not taking any bookings presently for 2020. We are however taking bookings for 2021.

Firstly, but most importantly, please be aware that whilst you may or may not be too concerned about the virus, others may feel very differently. We have implemented a large number of corona virus safety measures to help protect you, but we cannot do this without your cooperation. We want you all to enjoy your stay at Sherwood, so please, please, please, follow all on-site guidance closely, and be respectful, considerate and courteous to each other at all times.

Children must be closely supervised at all times – particularly those who are too young to understand the importance of social distancing.

We can't wait to see you all and welcome you all to Sherwood – we've missed you all!

Please though, if you know you have been exposed to the virus, and/or, if you or any member of your party are exhibiting any symptoms of the virus, please do not travel to Sherwood. We will happily move your booking to a later date, or issue you with a voucher to use at a later date. Please respect that we have a duty of care to all our guests, and cannot risk getting sick ourselves. You cannot self-isolate at Sherwood, so you really can't risk getting ill whilst here.

Finally, if you have any other concerns or questions, then please don't hesitate to get in touch. This is a very strange time for us all, and we're all learning to adapt to the new normal.

Risk Assessed Corona Virus Safety Measures at Sherwood Forest Holiday Park

Please note: that across the site, cleaning routines have been stepped up and comply fully with government guidance for cleaning in non-healthcare environments. This will include regular cleaning of all hard-surfaces and touch points such as elsan points, taps etc.

Reception and Shop:

- Check-in will take place outdoors. All new arrivals will be given a general overview of the site, and corona virus specific information.
- Only campers that have booked in advance will be allowed on-site.
- Payments will be taken in advance – preferred payment by contactless card. Cash will only be taken when no card available.
- The reception and shop will only allow 2 people in at any time and the 2m rule will be applied.
- The shop area outside reception will be clearly marked at 2m intervals to enable effective social distancing.

Shower Block:

- Currently there are no facilities open.

Laundry Block & Waste Disposal:

- Hand gel is provided at the entrance at waste disposal points – please use it
- Please wash your hands prior to and after using these areas.
- The floor will be clearly marked at 2m intervals to enable effective social distancing.

Campsite General:

- You must leave a minimum of 6m between you and your neighbours when pitching your Caravan or Motor home.
- Guests will not be able to have visitors to the site – please do respect this, as we are responsible for your safety whilst on-site.
- Our play parks are open at your own risk.
- We have isolation procedures in place and we will provide guidance on arrival of what to do should you become sick during your stay.
